SAME DAY EXCURSION TO AGRA

Early morning pick up from your place of stay and drive to Agra (203 Kms/3.5 Hrs)

On arrival in Agra, proceed straight to The Red Fort. Built principally as a military



establishment by Akbar in 1565, the red sandstone Agra fort was partially converted into a palace during Shah Jahan's time. Although Akbar built the principal structure, many additions were made by his grandsons. This massive fort is 2.5 kms long and is considered to be the predecessor of the Delhi Red Fort. There is only one entry point in the fort. The buildings and structures inside the fort give the

impression of a city within a city. Many of the buildings inside the fort are now closed for the public.

Next visit Taj Mahal - built in 1630 by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his

deceased wife Mumtaz Mahal to enshrine her mortal remains. The monument has been described as the most extravagant ever built for love, for the emperor was heart-broken when Mumtaz, to whom he had been married for 17 years, died in 1629 in childbirth soon after delivering her 14th child. The architecture of the Taj Mahal represents Islamic influence in its



purest form. Work started on this monument in 1634 and continued for almost 22 years. Situated in the city of Agra on the banks of the Yamuna, the Taj is enclosed in a garden amidst fountains and ornamental trees.

Evening drive back to Delhi (203 Kms/3.5 Hrs). On arrival drop at your place of stay.
