

Asian Meeting of the Econometric Society (AMES 2012)

1 The Econometric Society

1.1 Aims and objectives

The Econometric Society is the most prestigious learned society in the field of economics, with a world-wide membership. Its main object is to promote studies that aim at a unification of the theoretical-quantitative and empirical-quantitative approach to economic problems and that are penetrated by constructive and rigorous thinking similar to that which has come to dominate in the natural sciences. It operates as a purely scientific organization, without any political, social, financial or nationalistic allegiance or bias.

The four main activities of the Society are the publication of a journal, *Econometrica*; the publication of a monograph series in collaboration with the Cambridge University Press; the organization of scientific meetings in six regions of the world (including a World Congress every five years); and the conduct of elections for Fellow of the Econometric Society, an honorary designation highly valued by members of the economics profession.

The Society is a self-supporting nonprofit organization and operates on behalf of its members. The Society does not receive grants or aid from any outside organization, although some regions of the Society do raise outside funds for support of their regional meetings. The Society uses its financial surplus to finance travel grants to its quinquennial World Congress and to finance extra activities on behalf of members, such as a Members' Directory.¹

1.2 Brief history of the Society

The Econometric Society was founded in 1930, at the initiative of the Yale economist Irving Fisher (the Society's first president) and the Norwegian economist Ragnar

Frisch, who some forty years later was the first economist (together with Jan Tinbergen) to be awarded the Nobel Prize.²

As is evident from the history of Economics and the Econometric Society, an overwhelming majority of Nobel laureates in Economics and other intellectual leaders of the field have been office-bearers and fellows of the Society and have been plenary speakers at its meetings.

2 AMES 2012

AMES 2012 is the Asian regional meeting of the Econometric Society and it is coming to India for the first time.

2.1 Where and when

The host for AMES 2012 is the Department of Economics, Delhi School of Economics (DSE), University of Delhi. Sessions of AMES 2012 will be held at DSE and on the campus of St. Stephen's College.
